
I understand that appropriate professional dress is required of volunteers in the Me-Wuk program. Please wear clothing that covers the front and back of the body appropriately and doesn't have any inappropriate words or pictures that might be offensive to others. Shoes must be appropriate without a heel or a very low heel.

I understand there may be days when the ratio of adults to children may be already adequate for an optimal environment for the children and help may not be beneficial in the actual classroom with the children. It is possible to have too many adults in a child-centered classroom. If this occurs, which is rare, there are many possibilities for volunteering including cutting out art projects, filing, gardening, bulletin boards, etc.

I understand that in a lab environment one of the biggest needs for volunteers in the center is washing buckets, buckets of toys and equipment to keep our school clean and sanitized along with preparing bulleting boards, preparing materials for all curriculum activities such as art, science, math, literacy. Families are welcome to take home a bucket of toys to wash at home too.

I understand that my child is developing the skills of making friends and sustaining friendships, therefore, I may not stay in the classroom to follow and observe my child, as it may be disruptive to his/her ability to connect emotionally with his/her preschool family. The school has a beautiful observation booth set up for this purpose.

I understand with the support of the lab instructor or lab assistant, each calendar year one family member is expected to plan and facilitate one developmentally appropriate curriculum activity that represents an important part of the family's culture such as singing, playing instruments, reading, art, math, science, cooking, etc. Please sign up for a date during the summer session.
